AGENDA AND OBJECTIVES

The HIV Prevention Counseling series is made up of three workshops designed for health care professionals. *“The Facts”* serves as the foundation for *“The Fundamentals.”* *“The Fundamentals of Waived Rapid HIV Testing”* is designed for those who have attended the previous courses and will be administering the OraQuick rapid test.

THE FACTS is a one-day course that provides information concerning the spectrum of HIV disease, HIV antibody testing and developments in rapid testing, legal issues, partner counseling and referral services, risk assessment and reduction, and psychosocial issues.

THE FUNDAMENTALS is a one-and-a half-day course that provides guidelines and skill-building opportunities for professionals who implement prevention counseling within the context of HIV antibody testing. This workshop incorporates recommendations and strategies from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for personalizing risk assessment and risk reduction sessions.

“The Facts” is a prerequisite for this course.

THE FUNDAMENTALS OF WAIVED RAPID HIV TESTING is a one-and-a half-day skill-building workshop that will teach participants to administer the OraQuick test through both didactic and hands-on sessions. Participants will learn how to integrate the six steps of prevention counseling into the rapid HIV testing process. ***“The Facts” and “The Fundamentals” are prerequisites for this course. To register for this course, the applicant must intend to perform OraQuick testing at their agency.***
