

Redbud



Eastern redbud plants are graceful with arching branches, showy springtime flowers and beautiful heart-shaped leaves. They may vary in form from dense and round when grown in sun, to an open, taller form when grown in the shade.

The plants do well in soils of moderate to low fertility and are very drought resistant. Eastern redbuds should be transplanted in the spring or fall, in well-drained soils in sun to part shade. They should be watered regularly until established.
