

# MONITORING A SAFE HOUSE

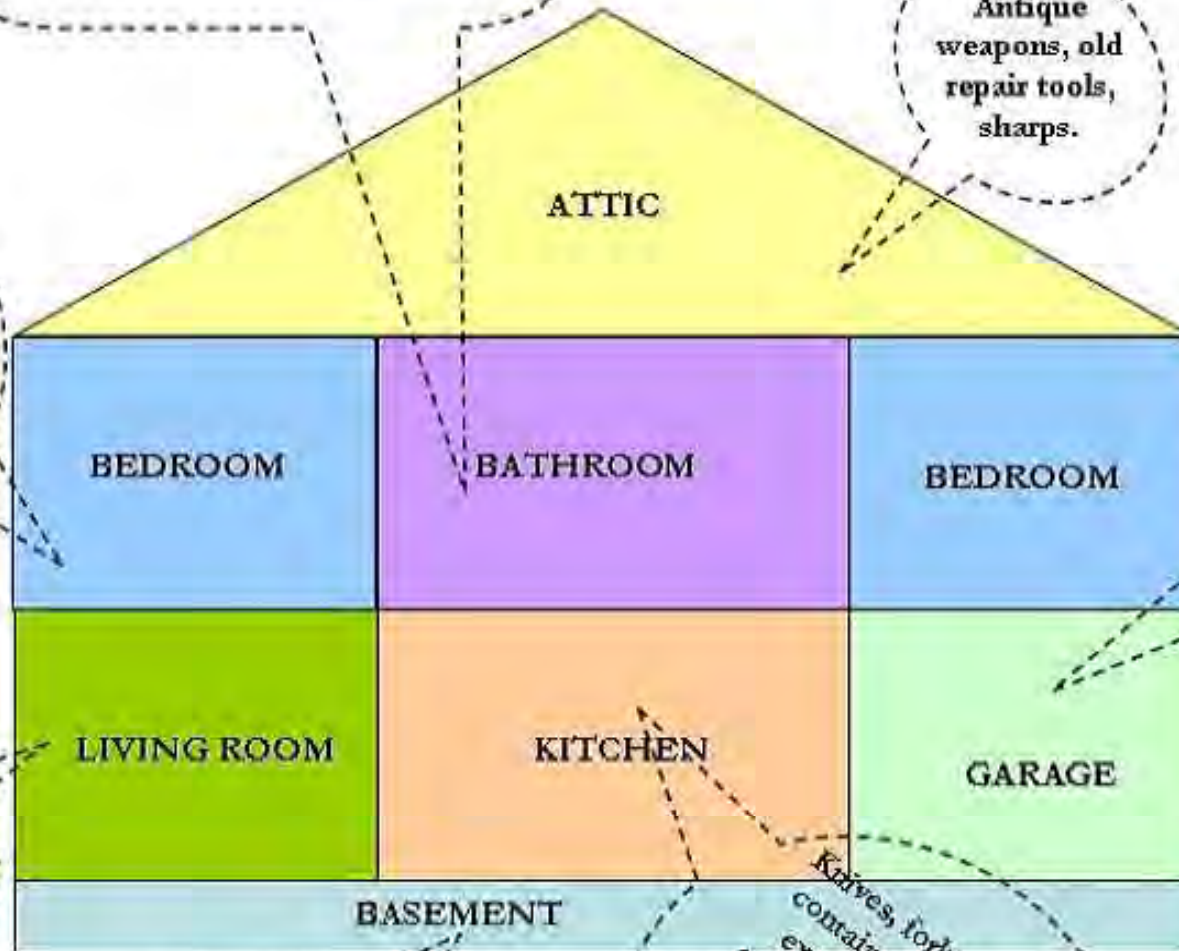
*(this is not an exhaustive list)*

Prescription and over the counter medication, scissors, tweezers, needles (medical and sewing); mouthwash, hand sanitizer, razors, rubbing alcohol, nail polish remover, body, deodorant & hair spray, aerosol spray.

Antique weapons, old repair tools, sharps.

Sharps, pills, cold and cough medicine, tobacco, weapons, drug paraphernalia.

Repair & gardening tools (hammers, nails, saw), guns/weapons, cleaning supplies, fuel, paint & paint thinner, hand sanitizers, alcohol/beer, wine coolers, wine, Freon, glue, rubber cement, spray paint, nitrous oxide, glue.



Aerosol spray, display weapons (e.g., swords), incense nicotine/tobacco lighters, sharps.

Stored wine, old paint, spray paint, gasoline, weapons, sharps.

Knives, forks, foods that contain alcohol (candy, extracts), spices, can openers, graters, alcohol, beer, wine, cooking wine, cleaning supplies, whippers, scissors, hand sanitizer, inhalants (whipped cream cans, dust off).

### *Just a Reminder!*

Regardless of whether illicit drugs, prescription medications and over-the-counter medications, weapons, and sharps have been an issue for the patient, it must be removed or locked up. For most families, this is as simple as dumping it out or giving it to a relative, friend or neighbor, or locking items in a safe. Although no home can be 100% safe of all possibilities, we ask that you make every attempt to remove or closely monitor any unsafe/dangerous items. **All illicit drugs should be removed from the home.**
