Objectives and Evaluation

Method of Evaluation: Subjective, based on clinical observation of knowledge, clinical skills, professionalism, communication: use VCU M4 AI Student Evaluation

As an Acting Intern on one of the busiest OB/GYN services in Northern Virginia, students will:

- -Perform the initial evaluation of patients admitted/consulted to the GYN Oncology service
- -Workup of new GYN oncology patients, History/Physical, differential diagnoses, manage and follow inpatient care with interdisciplinary team
- -Perform pre-op assessments, assist at GYN cancer surgery.
- -Follow up post-op patients with the specified attendings, fellows, and the PGY-4 ONC residents.
- -Participate in scheduled colposcopy outpatient clinic.
- -Participate in GYN Oncology conferences.
- -Learn management of complications of extended pelvic surgery including wound care, hyperalimentation, appropriate follow up protocols for GYN cancer patients.
- -See new patients, revisits, pre-surgical counseling, post-ops and outpatients.
- -Procedures: colposcopy, LEEP/cautery, EMB w/wo paracervical block, vulvar biopsy, vulvar excision, assist in gyn surgery
- -Hospital: rounds, surgery, interdisciplinary health team rounds weekly WCC 7 North.

The students will work with a gynecologic oncologist during the continuum of care: initial presentation of patient with discussion of differential diagnoses, management using various modalities of treatment; pre-operative evaluations; intraoperative management and post-operative care. The Oncology Team includes a PGY3 and PGY4 OB/GYN resident, GYN oncology fellow and weekly conferences with nursing and social work. Objectives:

- 1. List screening guidelines for cervical cancer and indications for screening of ovarian, endometrial, and vulvar cancer.
- 2. Describe the signs/symptoms of a patient with ovarian, endometrial, cervical or vulvo-vaginal cancer.
- 3. Describe the initial management of a patient with signs/symptoms of ovarian, endometrial, cervical or vulvo-vaginal cancer.
- 4. Describe the workup of a patient with an abnormal Pap Smear.
- 5. Describe the indications, contraindications, and risks for a hysterectomy.
- 6. Demonstrate how to write a complete and focused admission history/physical, post-operative note, and progress note.
- 7. Demonstrate how to tie a square knot using one hand, two hands, and instruments. Demonstrate basic suturing techniques including interrupted sutures, running locked sutures, subcuticular suture.

- 8. Use a hospital language interpreter or translator phone service at least one time during the rotation.
- 9. Describe: advanced medical directive, living will, and health care power of attorney.
- 10. Describe the FIGO classification of cancer of the cervix, endometrium, and ovary.
