

Emergency Medicine Physician ICD-10 Self Learning

Follow these four steps to complete the ICD-10 self-learning:

Complete the four-part course on HealthStream
 Log into HealthStream and click on the "Catalog" tab. Search for ICD-10 Training for Emergency Medicine Providers.
 This four-part course is approved for 1.5 AMA PRA Category 1 Credits.

Description: This course walks physicians through how to document diagnoses commonly seen by Emergency Medicine physicians. The course also covers concepts that are new or important to ICD-10, such as encounter types and mechanism of injury documentation, and links between conditions and their underlying causes needed to support medical necessity.
