

Family Practice ICD-10 Training Plan

The ICD-10 training plan for Family Practice is a two-part plan consisting of self-learning modules and interactive training.

Part 1: Self-Learning Modules:

A. AAFP Coding Toolkit: ICD-10 Educational Series



"Getting Ready for ICD-10" is a series of 11 brief online education modules developed to help family physicians and coders prepare for the transition to ICD-10, effective October 1, 2015. The modules are presented by an American Health Information

Management Association (AHIMA)-approved ICD-10-CM/PCS trainer and are between 10 and 20 minutes in length. The series includes vignettes specific to family medicine and questions to test your knowledge of ICD-10.

- 2. Document appropriately for ICD-10.
- 3. Follow guidelines specific to each chapter in the ICD-10 code book.
