



Obstetric and Gynecology ICD-10 Training Plan

The ICD-10 training plan consists of two parts: self-learning modules and interactive training.

Part 1: Self-Learning Modules

A. Free On-Demand Webcasts

Physicians should view the six free ICD-10 webcasts on the American Congress of Obstetricians and Gynecologists' (ACOG) website. (See login instructions below)

- 1. **ICD-9 to ICD-10: What to Expect** provides details on the primary distinctions between ICD-9 and ICD-10 with examples offered for OB/Gyn practices. The basic principles of ICD coding are addressed and their applicability to ICD-10 is explored.
- ICD-10 Documentation Guidelines discusses the clinical specificity necessary to appropriately assign ICD-10 codes. Clinical examples illustrating both effective and suboptimal documentation will be highlighted.
- 3. **ICD-10 Documentation Requirements** provides an overview of the conventions, guidelines and classifications used in ICD-10. The general principles of ICD-10 coding will be reviewed as well as the key guidelines applicable to the female genitourinary system and maternity care.
- 4. **ICD-10 Diagnosis Coding for Obstetric Care Complications** provides a review of the ICD-10 coding requirements for reporting obstetrical complications, including the clinical specificity necessary to appropriately assign diagnosis codes. The guidelines for reporting and sequencing multiple obstetrical complications will be discussed using clinical examples.
- 5. **ICD-10 Diagnosis Coding for Gynecological Conditions** discusses coding requirements for reporting common gynecological conditions including the clinical specificity necessary to appropriately assign the codes.
- Introduction to ICD-10 for OB/Gyns: A Smooth Transition focuses on the specific steps that providers, in all settings, should take to be ready for ICD-10 implementation – October 1, 2015.
