B. “ICD-10 Psychiatric” on HealthStream

Description: These courses provide important information for physicians on the ICD-10 coding system that will go into effect Oct. 1, 2015. Specialty-specific information is provided on the physician documentation requirements to support code assignment for diagnoses that have the most significant changes. The course also reviews coding system benefits.

Learning Objectives: Physicians will be able to identify the impact of the ICD-10 coding system to their own practice. They will be able to identify diagnoses that have the most significant changes along with the documentation requirements to support code assignment for those conditions.
